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Mid-Fall Parent Satisfaction Survey Results

Parents and students were asked to anonymously complete a Satisfaction Survey during the week of October Parent-Teacher Conferences. While the full results can be seen in the YPS office, here are some of the highlights. Every parent attending conferences was provided a survey for themselves and each student in their household. There were 28 student surveys and 16 parent surveys returned to the collection box. Each question was worth 4, 3, 2, or 1 points.

Parents rated "Teacher has high expectations" and "My child feels safe and happy at school" at 3.429 each for a tie of highest ranking. The lowest ranked question was "my child's teacher provides an education to meet the learning needs" at 3.3929.

Students rated "my parents are able to support my learning at home" the highest at 3.680, followed by a tie of 3.5600 for "teacher provides feedback on homework to help me learn " and " teacher uses many ways to measure my understanding." The lowest rating by students was "teacher meets my learning needs by individualizing instruction" at 3.4400.

Parents also completed questions about the superintendent and support services. A rating of 3.7333 for "the superintendent makes himself available to discuss concerns and ideas" and the lowest of 3.5833 for "the superintendent uses timely communication to inform all community members, " were items of note. Campus cleanliness, cafeteria, transportation, and special education were also highly rated. Finally, on a scale of 1-5, parents rated the Young Public School a 4.125.
